
Chapter 1: A Baby in a Basket


Chapter 4: The Red Sea


Chapter 5: Food from Heaven

In the desert, the people were hungry and complained to Moses. God sent special food called manna from heaven every morning to feed them. Moses told the people to trust God to provide for them.




Chapter 6: The Ten Commandments
