God spoke to Noah and said, "Noah, build a big boat called an ark because a great flood is coming."






Noah listened to God. He and his family worked hard to build the ark, just as God had told them.

It rained and rained for forty days and forty nights. The whole earth was covered with water.




The ark floated on the water, keeping Noah, his family, and all the animals safe.
